#### President's Message

May is a busy month for Waterloo County quilters in regards to shows. Do take in as many events as possible of the Quilt and Fibre Art Festival and all the surrounding quilt shows to support our fellow quilters.

I had a first experience as a quilter last month - my first big, big quilt show. I give credit to the Americans. They know how to do big - really big. But with big there are tricks to cope. The first is to forget fashion for the feet - go with comfort. Initiate conversations since guilters are a very friendly bunch of individuals and you get useful information. They are currently changing their policy so that their residents leave Sunnyside the same way they arrived which is through the front doors. As the email for this request circulated among our executive, we got excited about creating this quilt for them feeling this would be another extension of our Outreach Programme. We are hoping others in the Guild will join us for one day in early July to start and complete this quilt top. A design has been worked up, with a pattern and instructions and approved by Sunnyside. We plan to use some of the scrap bin's material along with donations from our stashes and we hope to have an example for you to see at the May meeting. A church basement has been donated for a place for us to work. You will hear more of the details of the day and the logistics of that day of sewing at the next two meetings and through emails. I would like to think that if I end my days at that home, I would exit with a quilt over my body.

## **Smile Quilt Update**

In December 2001 I started the Guild's Smile Quilt program. Since then our members have spent many hours stitching 1450 quilts for children that have been donated to the Grand River Hospital's Pediatric outpatient unit. Our first priority has always been to provide a quilt to all long term and/or life threatening childhood medical challenges. Throughout these years the program has grown to include in-patients, special clinics such as cystic fibrosis and mothers without doctors.

I have decided that I will step down as program co-ordinator as of June 2012. I am sure some member/members will be willing to take over this program. The job includes collecting quilts at Guild meetings, labelling and recording donations, putting identifying numbers on each quilt, delivery to the hospital and recording when a child receives a quilt.



#### From the 1949 Singer Sewing Machine Manual

"Prepare yourself mentally for sewing. Think about what you are going to do - never approach sewing with a sigh or lackadaisically. Good results are difficult when indifference predominates. Never try to sew with a sink full dirty dishes or beds unmade. When there are urgent household chores, do them first so that your mind is free to enjoy your sewing. When you sew, make yourself as attractive as possible. Put on a clean dress. Keep a little bag of French chalk near your sewing machine to dust your fingers at intervals. Have your hair in order, powder and lipstick put on .....

If you are constantly fearful that a visitor will drop in or your husband will come home and you will not look neatly put together, you will not enjoy your sewing as you should."


## Taking the Mystery out of The Shaded 9-Patch

Sew two segments together to make a 4½" x 5" rectangle

Fold the rectangle from the square (medium) down to the long edge of the rectangle as if you were making a square and press the folded seam. Fold from the other square the same way and press that folded seam. The dotted lines are the fold lines.







Place the rectangle right sides together on a dark 4½" x 5" rectangle and sew on the two lines created by the folds.

Cut up the center between the seams you have just sewn.







The two resulting blocks should measure 4½" unfinished. Each block finishes at 4 inches and...

Arrange in hundreds of different arrangements.




