I am a CQA/ACC member and, while reading the spring issue of "Canadian Quilter" magazine, I found an amazing new project on pages 52-55. (If you are not a CQA/ACC member, this magazine can be found in our WCQG library).

The article begins... "When is a quilt not a quilt? When it is a Pojagi (pronounced 'po-jah-ghee' or 'po-jah-kee' in Korean). Pojagi is an ancient Korean textile which often involves sewing pieces of fabric together without batting or backing. All the raw edges are enclosed in seams to make a reversible work of art." The finished size of the quilt is only 28" x 36" so a quick result is obvious. Hope you will give this new art form a try!

Pauline was given the honour of having her name included on the Ireland Canada Monument in Vancouver, B.C. "The monument honours Irish Canadians for their immense contribution to Canada."..." each name has been chosen on that person's contribution to their fellow Canadians, on



their commitment to do something good to build a better community locally or globally within Canada." Pauline's music and stories, especially those telling of Canadian history, have been recognized as her contribution.

Pauline is also the recipient of the Halton Heritage Award, the Burlington Junction Appreciation Award and the Hamilton-Wentworth Heritage Award.







It's great for the novice as well as experienced sewer and quilter. New videos are posted each Tuesday and Thursday at 2:00 p.m. Be sure to subscribe to this video channel and you will be notified in your email each time a new video is released. Design: An original or traditional design pieced or appliquéd that includes a flower and/or fauna element.

Statement: You must include a brief description of 50 words or less about the inspiration for your block.

Block: 12.5 inches square with raw edges. This includes the seam allowance. Blocks must be submitted unquilted and not on point. Blocks must be suitable for a bed quilt.

Material: Pre-washed cotton (preferred) or cotton blend, solid or print design fabrics.

Technique: Pieced and/or appliquéd. Block must not have an outside border.

Colour: Please include green (any shade) in your block.

Deadline: Blocks will be received at Schneider Haus, until 4:30 p.m., Thursday, April 11, 2019.

Blocks must be postmarked no later than April 4, 2019.





Using Up Scraps #22 with Vikki MacDonald It's time to put on our happy colours! It's Spring!

There is an alternate way to make a half square log cabin effect.







The one pictured in the photo starts with A being cut a 3½" square and the other "bars" being in 1" increments (finished) except for B which is 3" x 1"(finished). All the strips are cut 1½" wide. The finished block is 8", 8½" unfinished. There are many possible arrangements.




The second scrap quilt idea can be built in two different sizes.

Attach the blocks in rows, alternating right side up and upside down to get the wave effect.

Give your printed form to Ruthanne Snider, Elaine La Ronda or Marg Sandiford if you cannot submit it online.

The last day to submit your registration form is Wednesday, June 19, 2019.

Please be sure to read the information about quilt sleeves and hanging rods which can also be found on the website.

Your quilts need to be completed by early August. All registered quilts will be photographed at the Creative Sisters Quilt Studio on either Monday, August 12 or Tuesday, August 13. Specific times for photography will be set up later this spring. If you plan on being out of town on those two days, please arrange to have a friend take our quilts to the studio. The photographs are vitally important to Kathy Bissett as she colour coordinates the layout for the exhibit. The photographs are also compiled on memory sticks and sold at the exhibit.

We would encourage each and every member of the guild to exhibit a quilt this year. It does not matter if you are a Novice Quilter (a quilter with 2 years or less experience), or a Master Quilter (someone who has participated in a national or international show), whether your quilt is small or large enough to fit a king sized bed, all quilts are welcome.



Inspirations is an exhibit of quilts by the art KWiltconnection, a group of five southwestern Ontario, self-taught quilt artists who have been collaborating since 2014, and whose work has been exhibited locally, nationally and internationally. Their creative process evolves in mysterious ways that are surprising even to themselves. Although they each have individual styles, the collaboration as a group has a cohesiveness that is both intriguing and comforting. "Working together has challenged and inspired us to grow as artists, all the while solidifying our respect and appreciation for one another's talents".

ILENE ATKINS

llene studied Apparel Management and Fashion Design at Ryerson University. At that time, she felt confident in her ability to technically complete any project, but did not consider herself creative. As a member of art KWilt connection, llene is our group's "go-to" technical expert. She finds that this technical perspective is now the filter through which she views all her creative work.

DOROTHY HOLDENMEYER

Dorothy's modern esthetic and futuristic learned from painting, surface design and viewpoint is evident in her work which is often influenced by other artists, but which reflects her own dry sense of humour. She keeps us on track and focused on our goals.

enjoys combining many different artistic elements in her pieces, frequently integrating script-writing, eco-printing, and dense freemotion quilting into what seems to be an inexhaustible volume of completed work.

MARG NOTAR

Marg's eclectic style often includes aspects of whimsy and humour. Her work reflects her enjoyment of dabbling in different media, especially if it involves anything that sparkles! She enjoys a challenge and consequently attempts to bring what she's learned from painting, surface design and machine embroidery courses into her work with fabric, As a group contributor, Marg keeps us on track and focused on our goals.

JUDY PEARCE

Judy's background as a portrait artist is evident in many of her pieces. Her experimentation with inks, liquid dye and soy-based crayon for portraiture on fabric before quilting has added another dimension to her work. She loves to reclaim abandoned fabrics, making something beautiful from something that otherwise would be discarded. FOUR RED DOORS

Designed by Deborah Beirnes, Elmira, ON 2012

This method was first introduced in Sally Schneider's "Scrap Mania" book published in 1994 in a block unit she called "Mary's Triangles". Billie Lauder revisited this technique in her 2002 "Quick Quilt Tricks" book. I am introducing you to Sally's 1994 technique using my updated technique of no templates or specialty rulers needed. For Billie's technique you may wish to refer to her book.

You may choose to work with one feature fabric only, work in one colour family like the sample or work with a large assortment of scrap prints. I have included the number of strips to cut and how to subcut the strips. Labelling the cut units helps to keep you orgainized.

Finished Size: 40" x 44" Finished Block Size: 4"

Total Number of Blocks: 110

Block Setting: 10 blocks across x 11 blocks down

Fabric Amounts Based on 42" width of Fabric (WOF)

80 cm background (black in sample) 1.5 m feature fabric (red in sample) 40 cm binding (black in sample) 46" x 50" backing and batting

Pre Class Cutting:

Background: cut 7 strips 3 1/2" x WOF

: cut strips into 110 > 2 1/2" x 3 1/2" rectangles

: label these units "B"

Feature Fabric: cut 7 strips 2 1/2" x WOF

: from above 7 strips cut 110 > 2 1/2" squares & label "A"

: cut 7 strips 5 1/2" x WOF

: from above 7 strips cut 55 > 4 1/2" x 5 1/2" rectangles & label "C"

Binding: cut 5 strips 2 1/2" x 45"

Additional Supplies: Sewing Machine Rotary Cutting Equipment

> Thread to Match Fabric Flannel Back Vinyl Tablecloth to use for designing blocks





We have purchased some new library books! These 6 titles have already arrived and are in the library now.


