



Using Up Scraps #14 with Vikki MacDonald

Monochrome Scrash (Scrap + Stash) Quilts

These quilts are constructed with columns. Cut 7" wide strips of any length and in half lengthwise into two 3½" columns. Insert a 1" wide strip of a lighter value of the colour family. Make several varieties within your chosen colour family. Cut these new pieced columns into various lengths (block columns), anywhere from 2" to 14" - no rules. DO NOT PRESS.



Join various "block columns" into columns to be as long as you wish to have your quilt. Press AFTER joining the blocks, so that the 1" strips can be pressed in alternating directions. Next join enough columns to be as wide as you wish your quilt to be. Easy, eh?



Truly Scrappy Squares




Start with any size orphan block that measures either 6½" or 9½" or can be build it up to either a 6½" or 9½" square (including seam allowances). The squares and blocks can be of any colour or pattern.



Consider rows to be 18" wide (sewn). Working with trios of 6" blocks and pairs of 9" blocks the width of the quilt can be determined. Use different arrangements for each 18" row.

The arrangements below are both 54" wide.

150 blocks, each featuring the story of a Canadian Woman. The finished quilt resembles the "Dear Jane" style quilt.






