# January Program - Melissa Marginet - Beausejour, Manitoba "Myth—Quilting is an Expensive Hobby"



For our first meeting of 2022, the Program Committee is delighted to have Melissa Marginet join us. Melissa will present "Myth—Quilting is an Expensive Hobby", where she will talk about how anyone can afford to quilt. She will share quilts that she has made at very little cost and share her money-saving secrets.

Mellissa is an Canadian quiltmaker, author, teacher and quilt pattern designer. Melissa grew up next door to her grandmother and credits her for a great start to her creative life. She loves to teach and especially loves to teach quilting. In every class she teaches, she

learns something and is inspired.

Melissa has published two books: Walking Foot Quilting Designs and Edge-to-Edge Walking Food Quilting Designs. Her focus is to help people gain the confidence to quilt their quilts on their home sewing machines with a walking foot.

She has taught for Quilt Canada and the Saskatchewan Stitches Conference as well as guilds across Canada. Since June 2020, she has been teaching online throughout North American which includes the Virtual Quilt Festival and Road@Home.

She is a member of two quilt guilds - Manitoba Prairie Quilters and Winnipeg Modern Quilt Guild. She is also

the creator and webmaster of Quilt Manitoba, a website that lists quilt resources, links and activities for quilters living in, or visiting, Manitoba.


Calling all quilters .. once again the UFO Challenge is on .. but this time with a twist .. it's FREE!!










# JANUARY WORKSHOP



This is a fun day of learning techniques that will result in a lovely Zen Tree which measures 12" square. We will learn improv piecing as well as some walking foot quilting designs and how to use them within the patchwork. To finish the quilt, we will make a face binding that can also be used to hang your quilt.

This workshop will open to non-members on January 17, 2022. The fee for non-members is \$45.

# FEBRUARY WORKSHOP



# Scrappy Carpenter's Star with Michelle Crawford Saturday February 19, 2022 9:30am to 12:30pm

Fee: \$45

Michelle describes this class as a "technique class", where participants will become increasingly comfortable working with small pieces as they will work with 1" wide scrap strips. This is a template-free quilt pattern constructed by sewing strips to strips, sub-cutting and then sewing them back together to create the 12" square finished block. This can become a 47" square wall hanging where 5 blocks are sewn in one colour way, and the other 4 blocks are created in a complementary colour way. Once the blocks are sewn together, there will be a large 'open' area for hand or machine quilting to complement the design. A scrappy piano key type border is added after a frame border to complete the quilt. Michelle will share a variety of strategies to help participants gain confidence in cutting and sewing small pieces accurately. She recommends making one block during the class as a sample which can be used for a variety of purposes—and then perhaps move on to use this technique to construct additional blocks to make the wall hanging or quilt. The class fee includes the cost of the pattern.

Members of the sponsoring guilds and paying guests are welcome to submit up to two quilts each to the virtual quilts show. Please be prepared to provide the following information about your quilt(s):

- Quilt name
- Pattern designer
- Quilter, if other than yourself
- An artist's statement or brief history of quilt. (Limit of 50 words)
- Up to five photos for each quilt. We recommend an overall view of the quilt, along with several close-ups of interesting details.

Quilt show submissions will close on February 5, 2022.

# **Internet Resources for Quilters**

During our Monday afternoon Open Sewing times, there has been some discussion about making "Temperature Quilts", with a number of participants indicating they will be making a quilt of this kind or are considering the idea for 2022.

A temperature quilt is composed of 365 blocks – one for each day of the year. A block is created for each day using the appropriate colour or colours for the high and/or low temperatures for that day. Specific colours are assigned to a range of temperatures that are used for the blocks. In most cases the quilt represents the current year, but some people have made these quilts using temperatures from a special year, e.g. birth year, anniversary year, etc. Temperature quilts have become very popular in recent years. There are so many possible designs, e.g. using 2.5 inch squares, circles, flying geese, and so many more. Here are some internet resources that provide information about and might possibly inspire you to make a temperature quilt.

**Material Girl Quilts** – Amanda Caster, a quilter and designer for Riley Blake, has a blog post from February 2021 in which she describes what a temperature quilt is, how to plan a design, and get started on making your temperature quilt. 



  every kind of fabric.
- 7. To decide useful categories: fat quarters, strips, orphan blocks, measured yardage, batiks, novelty prints, etc. and file them on the shelves.

# President's SP611111111 Catherine Zurbrigg

Jean McFarlane: When did you start quilting?

Catherine Zurbrigg: I started quilting when I was 11 years old. My mother or pa-

ternal grandmother usually had a quilting bee in the wintertime. Grandma used to piece monogram quilts for each of my dad's aunts and uncles with an H, L

and M. She also had a crazy quilt on her guest room bed with which I was enthralled as a kid. I would trace the sewing lines trying to figure out how she got the corners so perfect. When I was about 11, Mother sat my younger sister and I down at the quilt and showed us how to make tiny stitches that went all the way through the quilt. She was FUSSY! If the stitches were too big, she would make us take them out and do them over!



### JMF: Who/what inspired you on your quilting journey?

**CZ:** My Aunt Marg really got me started piecing quilts, I went to her house one weekend after I was married and she showed me how to strip piece, cut, and lay out pieces for a 'rail fence'. She pressed, I sewed. We continued our quiltfests, making mystery quilts that Ruffled Elegance had each fall/winter from 1997 to 2004.


JMF: What type of quilting do you like best—traditional, modern, fabric art?

CZ: I like traditional quilts but more recently have been enjoying landscape fabric art.

JMF: What project are you most proud of?

**CZ:** My favorite quilt is a combination log cabin and maple leaf, 'Autumn Splendor' (shown above). My favorite fabric art pieces are the Blair Grist Mill, (left) the Pioneer Tower (right) and a

fun play piece I did for my sister of the family farm.



**CZ:** My favorite quilt story is about an old cardboard suitcase, a storage area and the mystery within. After many years of house cleaning, removing, and returning the suitcase to its place in my closet, Mother decided to toss it. I asked what was inside. We opened it

and found my maternal grandmother's quilt pattern, a few block sample and many, many butterfly shapes, cut out in preparation to be appliquéd on white



squares. To Mother's amazement, I asked for and was given the suitcase and its contents and my journey began—well, not exactly then... After high school graduation, 3 years of nurse's training, marriage, and raising 3 children, I hadn't thought about this project. Eventually, I sorted the butterfly pattern, removing many pieces because the fabric was too old and weak. So I replaced them with newer butterfly pieces

from fabric leftovers from my girls, my mother, my other grandma and my own. Hence, a "Heritage" quilt! (pictured at the lower left).

## JMF: What is something people don't know about you?


**CZ:** I love to read, play cards (bridge), watch hockey games on TV, walk in Victoria Park, and meet with friends.


Those colours, oh those colours


