Quilting tutorial videos are becoming very prolific on youtube and the internet. Here are three that I have found to be very helpful, quite inspirational and I have learned new ideas, skills and motivation from each one. Hope you enjoy them as much as I have. They are all free of charge.

Just Get it Done Quilts, One Block at a Time – I found this quilter during the summer, and have enjoyed watching all of her tutorials. Karen Brown, from Toronto, describes herself as a quilter, mother, daughter, wife, and business woman. She likes to try new things, find short cuts and new ways of using old things. With over 79,000 followers, her weekly videos on her you tube channel cover a wide variety of topics ranging from



"Dollar Store – Sewing Hacks" to "Using Colour in your Quilt" to "Scrap Quilting" to making a variety of quilt blocks. Lots to explore, lots to learn and best of all, Karen is a Canadian quilter from the Toronto area. (https://www.justgetitdonequilts.com)

Laundry Basket Quilts - Quilting Window Videos

My favourite quilter / teacher is Edyta Sitar of Laundry Basket Quilts. She is a very popular fabric designer, having designed for Moda Fabrics, and now with Andover Fabrics. She has published numerous books, has been featured in many magazines and her quilts have been featured and honoured in displays around the world. She has classes on Bluprint (formerly Craftsy), has a variety of videos on the "Fat



Quarter Shop Website" and the Missouri Star Quilt Company - and now is creating her own videos on her you tube channel "Laundry Basket Quilts Quilting Window". In each of these videos she demonstrates how to piece her patterns and includes a variety of skills and tips.




