





# Domestic Machine Quilting Workshops with Diane Loomis

#### General information:

- 1. Courses will be held at Mannheim Community Centre, 9:00 A.M. 4:00 P.M.
- 2. Sign-up will begin at the September meetings. There are only 15 spots available in each course so make your way over to the program table as soon as you arrive.
- 3. Each course is \$85. The courses are arranged in order of difficulty, and you may wish to take more than one.
- 4. Each course has a required kit containing items Diane prefers to use. These kits will cost approximately \$35, and payment will be made directly to Diane at the workshops.

In the event classes have not filled after our September meetings, enrolment to non-members will open September 17, at \$110 per course.

# Thursday, November 19: Fabulous Free Motion Fills (for beginners)

Here is your opportunity to try out machine quilting in a stress-free and friendly environment. Whether you are a "newbie", or have some experience but still aren't happy with the results, this class is perfect for you - Diane has all the tips and techniques to give you success. Learn to create free motion background fills that you can sew without pre-marking your quilt. Diane also demonstrates how to mark your quilt and create beautiful (and complex-looking) quilting designs that are easy to quilt.

Yes, you can do this!

**Friday, November 20: Heirloom Machine Quilting** (for confident beginner and intermediate levels)

Take your machine quilting to a higher level using free motion quilting techniques - backgrounds and motifs - to create an heirloom-quality wholecloth wall hanging.

Saturday, November 21: Classic Feather Plume (Intermediate/Advanced levels)

In this class you will embrace the feather motif, using stencils or designs of your own, to add elegance to all of your quilts. Diane will cover various techniques to enhance your feathers, showing them off to their best advantage.

# Quilt Exhibit - October 16<sup>th</sup> & 17<sup>th</sup>, 2015

The exhibit is only a month away! Thank you for all the preliminary work that you all have done so far. The quilts have been photographed thanks to Fred Hicks and there will be many ohhhhs and ahhhhs next month based on the reactions of the crew of workers during the photography sessions.

The work to be done is for the quilters to put a **label** with title (the same one you put on the entry form) name, date, place, *credit to the designer or pattern maker and quilter*, if used, and some include the size any other information such as to whom the quilt will be given. Labels are usually sewn to the back of the bottom right hand corner.

Some quilters need a better sleeve so that the quilt will hang properly. We did speak to those quilters and there is plenty of time to get that done.

Jan Hember will be giving us detailed instructions on <u>delivering our quilts</u> to RIM Park on Thursday the 15<sup>th</sup>. She has already thought out the pickup details at the end of the show. Please listen/read in earnest to her details. This will ensure the process of getting about 185 quilts in and out will go smoothly and that all the quilts go in the desired direction.

The <u>raffle tickets</u>- money and stubs and unsold tickets- **all** need to handed in or the Lottery people will be down our necks. Nita Timm and her sister Anni Hirsimaki will be looking for you if you haven't done this already. The draw will be on the 18<sup>th</sup> of October.

The very important <u>volunteer sheets</u> which Marilyn Weckworth has prepared will be there at our guild meeting. Bring your calendars to record the times for which you have signed up. Your volunteering is crucial for the success of our show
