




We are excited to have a very popular speaker from British Columbia join us on December 9th,


so be sure to mark your calendars!



Brighten a Child's Christmas 2020

Create a Mini Quilt to Cuddle a Stuffed Toy

Due to the challenges brought about by Covid-19, we know there are families (and in particular those with children) who may be experiencing increased financial hardships this holiday season. To help brighten a child's Christmas this year, we are inviting interested members of the guild to create a mini quilt that will cuddle a teddy bear or other stuffed animal. The mini quilt should be large enough to wrap around a teddy bear, e.g.

24 x 24 inches to 30 x 30 inches and should use fabrics and patterns that would appeal to children. Search your stash and create a fun colourful mini quilt. This may be a nice change from making masks.

Teddy bears or other stuffed animals will be provided for the mini quilts received. They will be

wrapped in these quilts with a ribbon tied securely around them. Once completed, they will be donated to the Toy Mountain Campaign sponsored through our local TV station. The stuffed toys are being provided through a donation received by the guild. Guild members are also encouraged - if they wish - to provide their own stuffed animal/toy. Perhaps this can be an activity for grandma and grandchild (or aunt and niece/nephew or parent and daughter/son) to do together. Invite your grandchild to select and purchase a new toy for which you will sew a mini quilt to accompany it. (If you are providing a stuffed toy, we ask that it be a new one.)

You are invited to make these mini quilts during the month of November. Completed quilts may be taken to the parking lot at Albert McCormick on Thursday, November 26 or Monday, November 30 from 1:00 - 2:00 p.m. They can also be dropped off

any time at the home of Inge Ford or Jean McFarlane. If it is easier for you, Jean or Inge are also available to pick up your donations from your homes: just send us an email or give us a call. Your donations of mini quilts and stuffed toys will be gratefully received.

The mini quilts and stuffed toys will be assembled during the first week of December and a delivery date arranged for early December.

Introducing... the Travelling Quilt Case

Laura Coia, of YouTube's 'Sew Very Easy' (and a guest speaker at our guild last year) has invited quilters to participate in a project called the Travelling Quilt Case. The purpose of this unique project is to keep quilters connected and have some fun along the way. Our guild executive has decided to pick up Laura's invitation and has created a Travelling quilt Case of our own. While we are currently unable to travel, this suitcase can travel without us. As Laura has shared, we don't really need to be with our suitcase to travel. She shares information about the project she

I designed in the following video. While our suitcase will operate a little bit differently, we invite you to I watch this video to learn more about the project.

Here is how the Waterloo County Quilters' Guild Travelling Quilt Case will work –

- A suitcase filled with items will travel from one guilt guild member to another.
- A travel itinerary will be established for our guild's suitcase. If you are interested in participating,
 please send a message to Deby Wettges indicating you would like to be part of the itinerary.
- Instead of creating a quilt with a centre surrounded by borders, participants will be invited to create blocks that will be put together at the end to create possibly three complete quilts. You may make one or more blocks. There will be a choice of log cabin block, slab block, or little house block. All instructions will be included in the suitcase. All completed blocks will be stored in the bags provided in the suitcase.
- Each travel stop will be able to keep the suitcase for one week.
- A travel itinerary will be provided with a list of all the travel stops. At the end of your week, you will deliver the Travelling Quilt Case to the next recipient. We ask that you also send an email to your travel consultant Deby Wettges, who will, in this way, be able to keep track of the loca
 - need to be altered. As with any trip, each participant is invited to take a souvenir from the suitcase provided in the souvenir bag — and replace it with a new one, e.g. some fat quarters from your stash or a sew-

Images for Show & Share

As the lucky member of our guild who receives the images for our monthly Show & Share, I am privileged to preview and refine what will be shared. What I want most to do is to showcase your quilts as well as possible, just as I try to do at our quilt exhibits. In the exhibits I have the actual quilt, while for *Show & Share* I have to work with images of your quilts. We are quilters and not photographers. However, there are a few things we should keep in mind while photographing a quilt. I'm using my recent *I Spy* quilt to illustrate what I can and cannot do with what is submitted.

Many images are taken with the quilt on the floor or other horizontal plain. It is important to get the entire quilt in the picture and to have any bright light behind you. That is why I chose the second image to work from. I was able to straighten it and to remove most of the background. I could not crop out (remove) all of the background because part of it was too close in colour to the binding of the quilt.







Images are also taken with the quilt being held. It is important to take the picture these pictures straight on with the light coming from behind the photographer. That is why I chose the second image to work from. I was able to straighten it and to remove most of the background. I could not crop out all of the background because it was too close in colour to the binding of the quilt.







Images for Show & Share (continued)

Ideally, images are taken with the quilt hanging on the wall or pinned to a design wall. The next images were taken with the quilt pinned to a design wall. Again, it is important to take the picture straight on with the light coming from behind the photographer. I rejected the first image because the top was not straight. I repinned it to the wall straightening the top as well as possible. There was nothing I could do about the upper left corner. I made corrections to "square" the quilt as I did with the previous examples. Because the dark binding of the quilt contrasts with the design wall, I was able to completely crop out the background.







Finally, of great importance is the size and resolution of the image. A large image can be reduced in size without losing its clarity. However, a small image of low resolution is difficult to enlarge clearly. Take a good look at your image before sending it. Make sure it is clear and in focus. If there is a choice in the size image you can email (small, medium, large & actual), send one of the larger ones.

The detail images to the right are different versions of the same image. I emailed them to myself, first in the "actual" size and then in the "small" size. The first one is clear, while the second one appears fuzzy and out of focus.





These are guidelines for images for *Show & Tell*. Images are manipulated for the presentation of our quilts. If we were submitting images for a competition, manipulating images in this way would not be permitted, with the exception ensuring the colour is accurate and cropping out the background.

I look forward to seeing the next quilts you will be sending my way.

So much depends on whether or not it will be safe to hold the exhibit and if we will be allowed to do so. However, our Quilt Exhibit is not forgotten. In the new year, the Guild Executive plans to assess the feasibility of proceeding with the show next October or if we will postpone it until 2022. We will keep you informed as discussions take place.

Although we can't meet in person at Mannheim for sewing days or workshops, we do have the opportunity to learn some interesting ways to create new projects when we meet for 'Sewing Together But Apart' days, enjoy speakers during our virtual monthly meetings or participate in on-line workshops. Hopefully, you will be inspired to create a special quilt for the exhibit, make a small quilt for the draw or a sale item for the boutique. Whenever the next exhibit happens, we will all be excited to see the results of all that Covid sewing!
