## Fall Foliage Quilt

I pieced the Fall Foliage Quilt using a Krista Moser Pattern and using Krista's specialty ruler. Krista Moser introduced this pattern in September 2023. By buying Krista's pattern, I was able to join Krista's Quilt Along. Every week, Krista issued a video on line illustrating different techniques that could be used in her Fall Foliage Pattern. I chose different colours from my fabric stash to piece the maple leaves.
The quilting was done by Trudy Dey. $55 " \times 70$ " inches

This quilt was a labour of love. It will be gifted to a wonderful couple that have both experienced health challenges. The star was inspired by a quilt in Kate Colleran's presentation to the guild. The quilting was by Barbara Pye $46 "$ x 56 "



I had some girlish fabric squares leftover from a previous project, so I put them into a smile quilt. Quilted by me with straight horizontal and vertical lines. $38 " x 43 "$

Since I was finishing Christmas projects, and I wanted to use up more of my Christmas fabrics, I decided to try a hexagon design. I used the "Hex N More" template from Jaybird Quilts, and her Candy Dish pattern. This will be a PAL quilt 57"x75"

Another UFO from a few decades back that is finally complete. The parts were almost all done - all of the hand appliqued pomegranate strips, and most of the strip pieced rectangles. In a burst of "finishing energy" this past January, I finished the top and quilted it in an all-over pattern. It will be a PAL quilt.

This is my oldest UFO, and it's finally done! Yey! Started in 1989 while pregnant with our 1st daughter. I remember cutting out the pieces using cardboard templates and scissors. I had begun quilting it "as you go" at the time, got about halfway, but didn't enjoy it, so it sat for a very long time in the "time out" drawer. A few years ago, I decided to take all the quilting out, sewed the blocks together into a complete top, put a different back on it, and quilted it on my longarm machine in an all-over pattern. It will be donated.
$64 " x 82$ "



These 2 quilts are using the log cabin squares from my stash strips (from "commercial" sewing in the 90's) to make PAL quilts. I sewed the tops; the PAL gals, Megan and Tamara, (with help from the guild:-) provided the batting, backing and label; Kathleen Knight wonderfully long arm quilted them both, and I bound them to complete them for warming and loving someone.


The Ballad of Songbirds and Snakes I used the first $21 / 2$ pages of the book by Suzanne Collins as quilted script to quilt this very simple quilt, by Amy Ellis, called Tipsy Triangles. It's a great design for when you just want to sew and not think. The background is a linen blend tablecloth.
It is for my granddaughter. 73" x 85"

This is an improv quilt of my own design, using a combination of fabric I designed and fabric acquired at Gatherings throughout the year. I added a few little hand embroidered flowers that you can't see in the photo. Red, white, and blue is one of my favorite color combinations! I'm giving this to a special girl who is turning 4. Machine pieced and quilted.

This is an improv baby quilt of my own design, using a combination of fabric I designed and fabric acquired at Gatherings throughout the year. I did some hand tying with embroidery thread and then decided to add some simple quilting lines. I folded the wide border fabric from front to back to make the binding and I love how the patterned binding looks against the pale blue backing fabric. Machine pieced and quilted.
27 " x 32"

## Accidental Landscape

With the help of Tina Tiimmins, I created this fun little project. Using Karen Eckmeier's technique of curved piecing, along with free motion quilting, and Tina's suggestion for embellishments, I added rocks, wool, and textured string to add dimension to the beach. I also added some piping to the binding and border. $15^{\prime \prime} \times 13^{\prime \prime}$

Here is my show and share for this month. It is a 10 " $\times 10$ " quilt block, which will be given to the Grand River Quilt Project. I created this quilt block to represent my childhood home, a farm behind the Nith River, where we had to use a footbridge, "the swinging bridge" when the river rose over the cement bridge. I machine-pieced and appliquéd this block and then used big stitch and embroidery to quilt it and add detail. All of the quilt blocks will be sewn into a larger quilt, with backing squares in the colour of the river or tributary they represent.
