president's Challenge 3 Yard Quilt

The First President's Challenge for the coming year is a 3 yard quilt. There is some wiggle room with the parameters—you can use 3 yards (1 yard each of three different fabrics, plus an extra quarter yard for binding, or you can use 12 fat quarters or scraps to add up to 3 yard of fabric.)



Pictures and comments related to the finished project must be submitted to Jean McFarlane by **November 10, 2021**. This will allow for the development of a slide show and poll to determine the lucky winner.

Many of our local fabric shops are carrying the Fabric Café books, that feature 3 yard quilts. Some of the shops have curated bundles ready to go. Other shops are happy to help in the selection of a fabric bundle.

Barn Quilts Across Ontario

Are you planning some road trips this summer or fall? Barn quilt projects have spread across Ontario. At this website, you will find information about how to make a painted barn quilt—but even more importantly—there are routes already planned out that can be travelled to view these barn quilts. Brant County Barn Quilt Trail (Brantford), Dutton Dunwich Quilt Trail (SW Ontario), East Chatham-Kent Barn Quilt Trail (Chatham), Elgin County Barn Quilt Trail (St. Thomas), Huron County BQT (along the Lake Huron shoreline), Longwoods Barn Quilt Trail (Middlesex), Native Women's Trail of Tears (SW Ontario), Norfolk County Barn Quilt Trail (Simcoe), Oxford County Barn Quilt Trail (Woodstock), Prince Edward County Barn Quilt Trail (SE Ontario), Ryde 135 Barn Quit Trail (Muskoka), South Essex Barn Quilt Trail (West of Leamington), St. George Barn Quilt Trail (South of Cambridge), Thames River Barn Quilt Trail (Chatham-Kent) and Wardsville Barn Quilt Trail (SW Ontario).



It has been a busy year for Casey so she is currently on holiday. However, she may start her visitations again if there is sufficient interest.




- Some of the events you can look forward to this year include:
